- a. Senate Bill passed for senior citizens for property tax

- b. Corbin Art Center will undergo renovations
 - c. Upper part of Cliff Park will be open
 - d. The city has money set aside to acquire land to create park/greenspace
 - i. Goal is for everyone in Spokane to be within 10 minutes walking of a park
 - e. PlanSpokane met and discussed the next 20 years of urban planning, highlighting areas with more consolidated property, one of the highlighted areas is in Cliff-Cannon.
 - f. Building a dock into the Spokane River, disrupting Centennial Trail. Two neighborhoods were not notified which is a requirement for permits to build.
