1. NRO Micah Prim
 - a. Door Hangers
 - i. Allows to connect with neighbors, and inform on crime in the area, as there has been an uptick in crime in this area.
 - ii. Vehicles parked in front of house, please leave any valuables in the car to prevent break-ins.
 - iii. Value info that can be collected from neighbors
 - iv. Use flooded light to help prevent crime in alleys, side yards, etc.
