

# CCNC General Meeting - June 2nd, 6PM - Woman's Club of Spokane

1. Call to Order - 1 minute
  - a. Glenn Banks called the meeting to order at 6:04PM.

    - i. NRO Prim discussed a prowling arrest that resulted from a neighbor report. SPD urges neighbors to call crime check @ (509)456-2233 with any information related to a white Ford Ranger connected to a car prowler in the area of Lewis & Clark.

  - v. Questions from the Floor:
    - 1. Kris Hansen asked about the PlanSpokane section of growth in CC regarding 14th down to the Park which will be zoned small commercial with no buffer for single family residential. Kris says this area is the only example of this arrangement in the City.
    - 2. Kris asked about WUI clean up on the Bluff. Kate explained forest demassification on the Bluff, but Kris expressed the area of the Bluff in Cannon's Addition has not been demassified. Kate will engage Nick Jeffries on this issue.
  - vi. C.O.P.S. - Doug McGuire - 5 Minutes
    - 1. C.O.P.S. volunteer base down to 48 volunteers, working to rebuild the volunteer base.
    - 2. Doug suggests setting up Block Watches. Doug has been trained by SPD to help neighborhoods create Block Watches. Block Watches help collect reports of potential criminal activity for SPD.
    - 3. Doug says SPD is understaffed, and praised the work of NRO Prim.
